## **Petition Summary**

The petitioner complains about the use of bioenergy in Sweden and puts forward two proposals in the form of laws. The first one would forbid water use as a means of transport for food waste and excrement from humans and animals after 2030. The second would entail that after 2030, thermal and chemical conversion methods of renewable organic material would be replaced by biological ones to protect biodiversity, air, water, soil fertility and food quality. The petitioner gives four examples of unsustainable practices in the current Swedish system, alleging an unsustainable combustion of renewable organic material that is misleadingly called "biomass" in a combined heat and unsustainable management of carbon and nitrogen in Malmö's waste incineration plant. She suggests that new legislation would help the market to adapt quickly and transition to sustainable goods, equipment, methods, and systems.
